Who We Are

The Carolina Clinical Education Consortium (CCEC) includes representatives from physical therapy education programs and clinical facilities that provide clinical education experiences.

North and South Carolina colleges/universities, which provide physical therapist/physical therapist assistant education in programs accredited by the Commission on Accreditation in

Physical Therapy Education are represented by the Academic Coordinators of Clinical Education/Directors of Clinical Education (ACCE/DCE). The Clinical members, five (5) from NC and five (5) from SC, are selected by the CCEC Board to serve a three year term on the Board.

The CCEC's primary purpose is to support physical therapy clinical education through education and communication. We provide quality programming that develops professional development within clinical education by hosting an annual conference which rotates between our academic partners. Participants will attend a two-day program that will provide an overview of pertinent issues clinical instructors encounter when supervising students. The workshop will address the clinician as an educator, facilitator of learning, assessor of both the student's readiness to learn and clinical performance, and manager of the exceptional student, as well as legal issues. The American Physical Therapy Association (APTA) recognizes this program as a Clinical Instructor Education and Credentialing Program. All participants must attend each session in its entirety and complete the Assessment to be eligible for credentialing. Other healthcare providers are not eligible for credentialing by the APTA and may not participate in the assessment center.

Jennifer Martin, PT, DPT, GCS is an Assistant Clinical Professor and Director of Clinical Education for the Doctor of Physical Therapy Program at Winston Salem State University in Winston Salem, NC. She completed her Bachelor of Arts in English at the University of North Carolina in 1994, was concurrently awarded her Master of Science in Exercise Science and Doctor of Physical Therapy from the University of South Carolina in 2005. She completed the Advanced CI Credentialing in 2008, and became a Certified Geriatric Clinical Specialist in 2015. As a former Site Coordinator of Clinical Education, a current DCE, and President of the Carolina Clinical Education Consortium, she brings a career-long passion and commitment to physical therapist education. Jennifer has presented on local, state and national stages.

Ashley Poole has been practicing physical therapy for the past 20 years in a variety of settings. She received her Master of Physical Therapy degree from The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and her transitional Doctor of Physical Therapy from Winston Salem State University. She is also a board-certified clinical specialist in cardiovascular and pulmonary physical therapy. Ashley is the Assistant Director of Clinical Education at Duke University's Doctor of Physical Therapy program where she supervises students in the clinic as well as teaches cardiopulmonary and complex medical management courses. She has spent the last decade of her career working in acute care at Duke University Hospital with a primary focus in cardiology. She has developed early mobility and exercise protocols in the critical care setting and is currently a member of the cardiac ICU research committee where she is spearheading a project to further progress patient mobility in the ICU. Her current research interest is examining frailty status in patients with advanced heart failure and determining how frailty affects post-operative outcomes in those undergoing ventricular assist device and heart transplant surgeries. Ashley is a member of the APTA Cardiovascular and Pulmonary Specialty Council and serves on the nominating committee for APTA North Carolina. She is an APTA Advanced Credentialed Clinical Instructor and also an APTA Credentialed Clinical Trainer of the CCIP Level 1 course.

Dr. Schulken has extensive clinical practice experience, primarily in orthopedics and sports medicine, but also has a strong background in Industrial Rehabilitation. Prior to joining the DPT faculty, she served four years as a staff physical therapist at the Womack Army Medical Center at Fort Bragg, NC. She also served 21 years as a Physical Therapist and the Regional Outpatient Supervisor for the Cape Fear Valley Health System in Fayetteville, NC. Credentialed Clinical Instructor Program Level II (CCIP Level II) is the successor to APTA's former Advanced Credentialed Clinical Instructor Program (ACCIP). This voluntary program is designed for physical therapists and physical therapist assistants who have successfully completed the APTA Credentialed Clinical Instructor Level I Program (CCIP Level I), and want to further develop their clinical teaching skills and construct a clinical curriculum. The unique philosophy and design of CCIP Level II both applies and goes beyond the concepts of the structured learning environment of CCIP Level I to enable clinical educators to achieve the best outcomes for student learning. This voluntary program is designed for physical therapists and physical therapist assistants who have supervised or overseen the supervision of at least one student in clinical practice, or have been actively involved in student learning and education since receiving the APTA CCIP Level I credential. Program participants must complete prerequisites including completion of a CCIP Level II Participant Dossier, a series of 3 online professionalism modules, and review of 4 articles, in addition to completing a live 2-day program with an Assessment component.
